In today's Gospel, our Lord reminds us that we cannot serve two masters. We cannot serve God and mammon (worldly riches that become our purpose for living). Each one of us must make a decision. Do we prefer temporary earthly pleasures that cannot bring us a true and lasting happiness or will we live our lives for the eternal joys of heaven that which alone can be our true and lasting happiness? Our thoughts, actions and the fruits of those actions which St. Paul mentions in the epistle, reveal which choice we have made so far. Are we living for Christ or for ourselves? Let us recall that if we live for ourselves we fall by default into the hands of the devil who is much stronger than us.
