First Sunday of Advent



"Brethren, know that it is now the hour to rise from sleep because now our salvation is nearer than when we came to believe. "How perfect this reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans is for us on this 1st Sunday of Advent, the first day of a new liturgical year. Holy Mother

Church wants us to wake up and realize the important task we are now engaged in, namely our eternal salvation! We too like the Roman converts have wasted too much time and have offended our heavenly Father much too often. We live as if this life will go on forever. But the reality is that the night is far advanced, our days in this world are indeed limited and are swiftly passing. However, we still have time to decide where we will spend our eternity. This holy season of Advent, a word which means "a coming" or "a visitation", is meant not only to prepare us for Christ's coming at Christmas, an event that occurred some 2023 years ago, which we will celebrate this coming Dec 25th, but even more importantly it is to prepare us for Christ's second coming! Today's gospel contains Our Lord's own description of that Second Coming. On that day we will have to face Christ coming not as a little baby but in "power and majesty". On that day our innermost faults will be made known and our every unforgiven sin will shout out in testimony against us. Such a sobering thought should cause us to see TODAY as an opportunity to confess those sins and make up for them while we still can! This is the whole idea of Advent-PREPARATION FOR THE COMING OF CHRIST—PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE! On Christmas, that world changing event that transcends both time and space, the Babe of Bethlehem who was born some 2023 years ago still calls on us today in Dayton, Ohio to come and worship Him NOW while we still can because the day is indeed rapidly approaching when He will come again—this time to judge us! If we welcome Him now, if we open up our hearts to Him as that lowly stable was open, if we prepare Him a home in our heart He will grant us an eternal

home in His heavenly kingdom which shall have no end.

This Friday, Dec 8th, we celebrate the Feast of



the Immaculate Conception. This Holy Day commemorates the fact that the Blessed Virgin Mary, in view of becoming the Mother of God

CONCEIVED WITHOUT
ORIGINAL SIN in the
womb of St. Anne. This
was infallibly declared by
Pope Pius IX in his papal

encyclical, *Ineffabilis Deus*, of December 8, 1854. It is therefore a dogma of the Catholic Church which we must and can believe fully confident of its veracity. MASSES WILL BE AT 7AM (LOW) AND 7PM (HIGH). NO 6PM HOLY HOUR THIS FRIDAY DUE TO THE HIGH MASS. OUR LADY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION, PATRONESS OF THE USA—PRAY FOR US!! RORATE MASS THIS SATURDAY 7AM!

This very special Sung Mass is a votive mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is traditionally sung before dawn by candlelight as we prepare to welcome the Light of the World at Christmas. The Mass takes its name from the latin word which begins the introit "Rorate caeli de super et nubes pluant justum". Drop down dew ye heavens from above and let the clouds rain down the Just One! 4) daily mortify the flesh with exercise (walk or run or cardio or strength workout) and /or some other penance such as giving up a certain food or drink you especially like, quitting any bad habits, keep off internet, facebook or video games or texting 5) Look for or create opportunities

for RANDOM ACTS OF KINDNESS!

6) receive the sacraments of Holy Communion daily if possible and confession at least monthly. 7)Before going to bed each night make a short examination of conscience and act of contrition . O COME O COME EMMANUEL!!
