## The Third Sunday After Epiphany

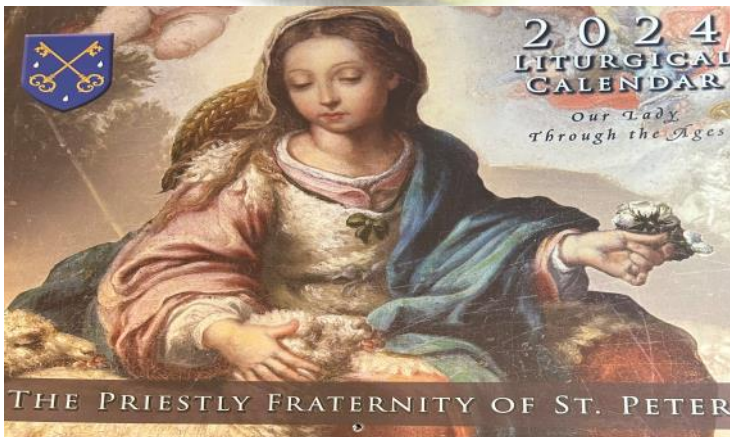
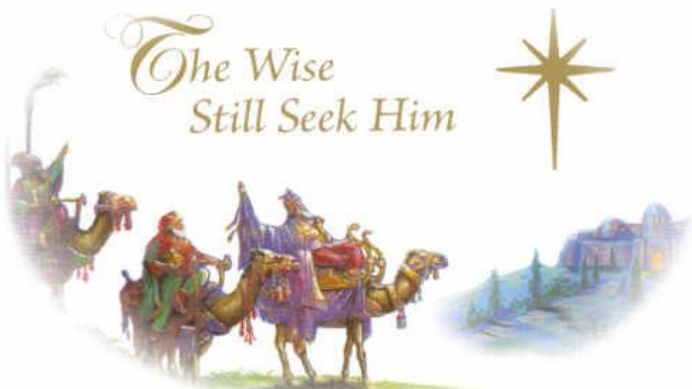
Today the Introit, Gradual, Offertory and Communion all testify to Our Lord's Divinity. In the Extraordinary Form we continue to rejoice that our Messiah has come. We prepared for Him during Advent. We now continue to celebrate His coming even though others seemingly have already forgotten Him and the importance of His birth. The Christmas tree was down and out by the side of the road Dec 26th. "The Holidays are over" they say. But Mary and Joseph did not leave Jesus at Bethlehem that first Christmas and forget about Him until next year. NO! After their sojourn into Egypt to protect Him from Herod they took Jesus home to Nazareth with them where He grew before them with each day being an enormous gift from God. Do we realize that gift? Is the Christ Child, the God-Man, growing in our hearts? In the epistle St. Paul reminds us "Be not overcome by evil but overcome evil with good." The Light of the world has come as a little baby. Remember that light dispels darkness. There is no darkness that can put out the light of even the smallest candle! In the Gospel we find the Roman Centurion asking Jesus to heal his servant who was at the point of death. Jesus agrees to come but the Centurion says "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof: but only say the word and my servant shall be healed." And the scriptures tell us Jesus marveled at these words and said "I have not found such great faith in Israel." ... "Go your way, as you have believed, so be it done to you." And the servant was healed at that moment. Faith in Jesus! This Gospel passage is used in the Traditional ritual of the Anointing of the Sick which we call Extreme Unction. It is a very powerful sacrament that is given in "periculi mortis" in "danger of death" and many times we see healing that seems to be miraculous. How great is the power of Christ to those who believe! It is also used in articulo Mortis—at the moment of death with the last rites. In this case God shows His power not by curing but by His mercy given to the faithful who believe in Him! Let your faith in the Christ Child grow within you this year!

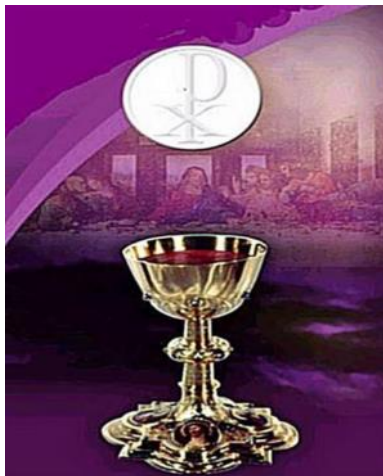
