QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY

Today is the last Sunday before Lent. In the epistle St. Paul exhorts us to practice the greatest of all virtues which is charity. In the Gospel we have the proof of God's charity to us. Jesus tells His apostles that He is going to Jerusalem and that He will be mocked, scourged, spit upon and then they will put Him to death. He sets His Face towards Calvary! "and they understood none of these things that He was saying" "Greater love than this no man has that he lay down his life for his friends". Jesus knows exactly what is going to happen to Him yet He still goes for love of us. What will we do for love of Him this Lent? Like the blind man in the Gospel today let us ask— "O Lord that I may see!" How much we would be willing to sacrifice if we could truly see how much He loves us and suffered for us, how terrible our sins are before our Almighty God and how great heaven will be!

ASH WEDNESDAY-OBLIGATORY DAY OF FAST AND

<u>ABSTINENCE! – MASSES at 7AM & 7PM.</u> Lent officially begins THIS WEDS! Although not a holy day whereby we are obligated to attend Mass, it is however <u>an obligatory day of fast & abstinence</u>. Ashes are blessed and distributed <u>at the beginning of Mass</u>. Let's start Lent off right!

<u>ABSTINENCE</u> – means not eating any meat, soups or gravies that are made from the meat of warm blooded animals. (Ash Wednesday and ALL FRIDAYS of Lent are

days of abstinence under pain of sin!) <u>LENTEN FAST</u>—generally means only one full meal per day with meat (unless it is a day of abstinence). Two other meatless meals are allowed but the quantity of these two small meals together should not equal the amount taken at one "regular" meal. Snacking between meals is NOT ALLOWED but liquids may be taken, however, the stricter the penance the greater the grace! The laws of fasting are not binding on those with medical conditions that would cause harm to oneself or to an unborn child

within the womb or the elderly over 59 years old. LETS MAKE THIS THE BEST LENT EVER OFFERING UP OUR PENANCES FOR A CONTINUED FREEDOM OF THE LATIN MASS, FOR OUR COUNTRY AND TO STOP THE KILLING AT THE KETTERING ABORTION MILL AND THROUGHOUT THE WORLD!!
