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

Passion Sunday

As you noticed by the statues veiled in violet today we enter into what is traditionally known as Passiontide. From Septuagesima Holy Mother Church has called us to follow Our Lord's footsteps in the course of His apostolic ministry. Now in Passiontide, she is clad in mourning and veiled in purple as she contemplates the sorrowful events of the last two weeks of Our Redeemer's mortal life. During Passiontide Psalm 42 and the doxology (Gloria Patri...) are omitted in the prayers at the foot of the altar for masses of the season. This is done to bring out the Church's sadness of the suffering of Our Lord which now becomes more intense as His Passion and death nears.

In the Gospel Our Lord's situation with the Pharisees and Scribes is becoming heated. He calls them liars and they take up stones to kill Him and so He hides Himself and departs from the temple. How ironic since the temple was built for God yet the Son of God, Jesus, is not welcome in His own home! Is this not what we have done when we commit sin, especially mortal sin which drives Jesus out of our souls? During Passiontide, the last two weeks of Lent let us open our hearts and our souls to Jesus by making a good examination of conscience and a sincere and contrite confession. Invite Jesus back into His holy temple which is your soul! Let us follow Him to Jerusalem and Calvary so that we may rise with Him on Easter Sunday! Until then think of Him often. What was He doing that first Passion week just two weeks before His death? As God HE KNEW what was going to happen. Yet He still goes! Was He thinking of you? Did he think all the suffering He knew He was going to suffer was worth it for your sake? Do not let His

blood be in vain for your soul!

YOU ARE NOT IRISH? That's okay because neither was St. Patrick! He was actually born in what is now known as Scotland the son of a Roman father and Christian mother. At the age of 16 a group of barbarians landed in Scotland to pillage the town. They took away Patrick and sold him as a slave to an Irishman who made him watch his cattle and sheep on the side of a mountain and provided him with practically nothing to maintain his existence. In privations and in nakedness he suffered hunger and faced cold, rain and ice. How appropriate this feast falls in Lent since it was through privations, sufferings and prayer that Patrick heard the voice of God and became a saint! God had pity on him and gave him grace and an inward peace to seek His Creator God. Patrick heard His voice and responded to it with a strong interior life. He began to pray fervently to God and offer his hunger and sufferings up to Him. Finally God inspired him to leave his captivity and to go to the seashore where he was allowed to board a boat back to Britain. He studied for the priesthood and heard God 's call for him to return to his former masters and convert Ireland to

Catholicism as the king was a pagan following Druid practices. Patrick converted them and Christianity became the faith of the people and remains so to this very day! St. Patrick is many times portrayed as driving out the serpents from his new homeland. Let us therefore imitate this great saint by asking God through his intercession to touch our hearts as He did St. Patrick to love Him more especially by our penances, prayers and sacrifices this lent!! Do not fall into the American fallacy that we celebrate by drinking green beer in excess! The true Irish do not do that! But let us again imitate him by beseeching this saint to truly hear the voice of God and do His will in all things! ST PATRICK- PRAY FOR US!!

OUR DEGREE OF GLORY
