SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

The paschal joy which now permeates our liturgy and hopefully our lives, is inseparable from the freedom from sin and the hope of our participation in divine life with Our Risen Lord. Like a seed this blessed joy is destined to grow and blossom into the Beatific Vision, seeing God face to face IFF we stay near Our Good Shepherd and hear His voice.

Hopefully our Lenten fasts and sacrifices have made us stronger. How are we able to persevere in the joy and grace that we accomplished this past Lent? In the words of St. Peter's epistle today it is by being "strangers and pilgrims" to the things of this world. In other words by not becoming too attached to them.

We looked into the Face of Mercy while making the stations of the cross, Our Lord's face beaten and bloodied, His head crowned with thorns but soon—in a little while— we shall see his Glorious Face, the face of the Good Shepherd who loves us with an infinite love! This shall be either the GREATEST DAY of our life or the WORST! YOU DECIDE BY HOW YOU LIVE UP UNTIL THAT DAY! Let us therefore continue to be pleasing to Our Good Shepherd. Hear His voice and let Him hear yours. Stay close to Him so we will be ready
