
#### TENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



Let us ask ourselves:
"Who do I resemble
most when I pray—
The Pharisee or the
Tax collector? How
can I improve my
prayers? Prayers
are a key to open
grace to us and lock
away evil. Lord
teach me to pray!"

Today's parable ranks with the Prodigal Son and the

Good Samaritan in its popularity and in clearly teaching a moral truth. In particular it warns us to avoid pride and to practice true humility and in so doing teaches us how to pray effectively. The hypocrisy of the Pharisee who puts on a veneer of sanctity to cover up a heart of pride has caused the name "pharisee" to be synonymous with "hypocrite" in languages throughout the world from the time of Jesus even to today. This man attributes nothing to God. His "prayer" asks nothing of God. He glories in his own good works which he loudly proclaims before men. He rejoices in the fact that he is not like the rest of men. after all God must love him better (at least in his own mind!) The Tax Collector on the other hand is the very symbol of humility. With head bowed, with a contrite heart, he recognizes his guilt -not his talents or good works- and feels true remorse and contrition for his sins. But with the virtues of faith, hope and love, inspired by the Holy Spirit whom St. Paul calls the "Source of All Good" in today's epistle, the Tax Collector humbly yet confidently asks pardon of his Heavenly Father, beats his breast and PRAYS: "Have mercy on me THE sinner" It is the humble repentant sinner whose prayer is granted and who walks out of the temple justified!! Ask yourself "How do I pray? Which man am I?"

#### JUBILEE YEAR 2025—PILGRIMS OF HOPE!

This Year's Jubilee is designated as one of Holy Hope! The Year of Jubilee is a biblical concept deeply rooted in Scripture and Tradition, offering the faithful a time of renewal, forgiveness, and celebration. A significant aspect of the Jubilee Year is an invitation to make a pilgrimage to Rome. Catholic pilgrimages to Italy in 2025 focus on visits to the Vatican and Rome, including passing through the opened Holy Doors of Rome's major basilicas (St. Peter's Basilica, St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. John Lateran; and St. Mary Major). Passing through a Holy Door symbolizes crossing into God's grace and mercy. But if you cannot go to Rome here in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, three locations have been designated as Jubilee Pilgrimage Sites: the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Peter in Chains, the Shrine of the Holy Relics at Maria Stein, and Emmanuel Catholic Church in Dayton. A pilgrimage visit to any of these sites can apply to the reception of the Jubilee Indulgence under the usual conditions! The bronze serpent reminds us of when the poisonous serpents were biting the Hebrews a bronze serpent on a tree was made and all who looked upon that tree and serpent were saved from

their afflictions! The tree represents the cross with Jesus taking on our sins to heal us! (Num 21:8)
