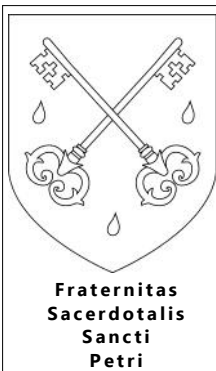

In today's Gospel, MT 9:18-26, Our Lord performs two miracles in one day. First he healed a woman who had suffered from a hemorrhage for twelve years. She simply touched the tassel of His garment and was instantly healed. Jesus said to her "take courage daughter your faith has saved you." And as if that were not enough to prove His power as God, Jesus then went to the house of Jarius and raised his daughter from the dead! By these miracles Jesus proves He is God and He cares for us!! No matter how bad the situation seems do not give up! Remember Jesus is God and NOTHING is impossible with God! I recall the words of a holy priest who once said to a woman who had just had her prayer answered and asked the priest if he believed that was God's miracle.
